The historic centre of Cracow, the former capital of Poland, is situated at the foot of the Royal Wawel Castle. The 13th-century merchants' town has Europe's largest market square and numerous historical houses, palaces and churches with their magnificent interiors. Further evidence of the town's fascinating history is provided by the remnants of the 14th-century fortifications and the medieval site of Kazimierz with its ancient synagogues in the southern part of town, Jagellonian University and the Gothic cathedral where the kings of Poland were buried.

The Wawel Royal Castle and the Wawel Hill constitute the most historically and culturally important site in Poland. For centuries it was the residence of the kings of Poland and the symbol of Polish statehood, the Castle is now one of the country's premier art museums.

The Bazylika Mariacka (Saint Mary's Basilica) is undoubtedly one of Krakow's most famous and most spectacular landmarks. It towers over the northeast corner of the Main Market Square, its delicately sculpted turrets peeking over the roof of the Sukiennice (Cloth Hall), visible from all over the city. Like so many places in this enchanting city of Krakow, the Mariacki church towers are swathed in legend. The Cloth Hall (In Polish Sukiennice) in Kraków dates to the Renaissance and is one of the city's most recognizable icons. It is the central feature of the main market square in the Kraków Old Town. It was once a major centre of international trade.

The post-camp relics are protected by the Museum created in 1947. The Memorial today is i.a. the Archive and Collections as well as research, conservation and publishing center. KL Auschwitz was the largest of the German Nazi concentration camps and extermination centers. Over 1.1 million men, women and children lost their lives here. The authentic Memorial consists of two parts of the former camp: Auschwitz and Birkenau. A visit with an educator allows better understanding of this unique place. There is no way to understand the postwar Europe and the world without an in-depth confrontation between our idea of mankind and the remains of Auschwitz.

Kościeliska Valley is the second longest Valley on the Polish side of the Tatra mountains with the length of 9km. It is one of the most beautiful and easiest Valleys which is easily accessible for everyone. It's characteristic is a big number of caves and other unique rock forms.

06 Oct 2015 Morskie Oko Lake - 6 hours

Morskie Oko Lake is the largest and fourth deepest lake in the Tatra Mountains. It is located deep within the Tatra National Park, in the Rybi Potok Valley, at the base of the Mięguszowiecki Summits. The peaks that surround the lake rise about 1,000 meters above its surface; one of them is Rysy (2,499 meters), the highest peak in the Polish Tatras.

04 Oct 2015 or 07 Oct 2015 Rusinowa Polana - 4 hours

The trail starts by driving through picturesque route Głodówka. Then you will be trekking to the Rusinowa Hall, which is famous of its breathtaking view of the High Tatras.

On the Rusinowa Hall is pastoral center and only 5 minutes walk to Wiktorówki - the wooden Shrine of Matki Boskiej Jaworzyńskiej. The route back runs through Gold Valley. You can also visit the Jaszczurówka Chapel which was designed by Stanislaw Witkiewicz.

06 Oct 2015 Kasprowy Wierch Mountain - 4 hours

We will complete the trip at the terrace by the restaurant overlooking the peaks of the Polish High Tatra mountains and the whole of Podhale region.
